Baptisms are scheduled on Easter Sunday, April 16, during both the 8:45 and 10:45 a.m. Masses and after the 10:45 a.m. Mass.
- **You may have two sponsors (Godparents), one man and one woman, or just one sponsor.** At least one sponsor must be a Confirmed, practicing Catholic and they must be at least 16 years old.

## Reflection

Tomorrow we celebrate Martin Luther King Day, in observance of his birthday (actually January 15). He was probably the chief spokesman for nonviolent activism in the Civil Rights Movement in the 1960s before his assassination on April 4, 1968.

Most have heard of his speech, I Have a Dream, at the March on Washington on August 28, 1963. It was one of the largest gatherings for human rights in the United States. That day he said, in part, "If you lose hope, somehow you lose the vitality that keeps life moving, you lose the courage to be, that quality that helps you go on in spite of it all."

I wonder if he were alive today what he would say, how he would view our country. Somehow I think he would still believe in the power of hope. I know I believe that hope still underscores our very being.

## Numbers Tell A Story

The days — and the years — go by quickly. Sometimes we just have to stop and think back about what we do day in and day out. Just thinking about the sacraments celebrated at St. Victoria each year is a good snapshot, especially considering the preparation necessary for each. Last year, we celebrated 52 Baptisms (56 in 2015); 13 weddings (12 in 2015), 58 children made their First Communion (71 in 2015), 70 youth were Confirmed (65 in 2015) and we joined families and friends in celebrating the lives of 22 individuals who passed away this year (23 in 2015). It is our priority to make sure that the stops along each individual's faith journey is faith-filled and prayerful.

## CSA Countdown

As the Catholic Service Appeal (CSA) Foundation prepares for the 2017 appeal, they announced that the 2016 goal of \$9.3 million in pledges has been reached. This is the first time in 10 years that the number of donors went up from the previous year and the number of parishes reaching their goals also went up. (While we made a good showing, St. Victoria did not meet its goal.) The CSA serves 17 Collective Ministries ranging from the American Indian Ministry to our Venezuelan Mission with many deserving ministries in between.

The Archdiocesan Council of Catholic Women (ACCW) is one of those ministries. The women think, pray and act and have a voice in our Church. They are, perhaps, best known for their Appalachia Christmas Gift Project, an activity that St. Victoria women have been involved with, shopping for gifts for those in need in Appalachia. For many years **Dorothy Kelzer**, a member of ACCW, spearheaded the project here at St. Victoria.
