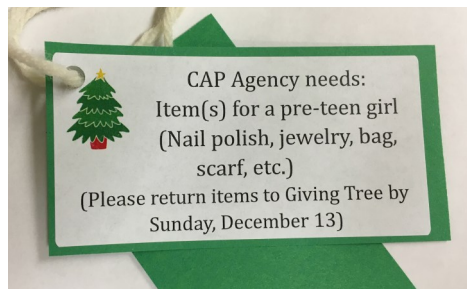

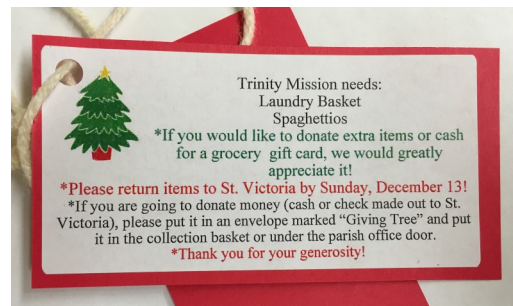
# ST. VICTORIA GIVING TREE
