Faith Formation

Faith Formation Volunteers for Grades K-10:

It takes many dedicated volunteers to offer a faith-filled and service-centered religious education program for our children. Team teachers, child care volunteers, hall monitors, hospitality, small group leaders, bakers, decorators, office help and permanent subs are needed to run this program smoothly for the children and families who participate. If you are interested in getting involved in our Faith Formation and Sacramental programs, we would love to hear from you.

Vacation Bible School:

This is an amazing summer program for children ages 4 through Grade 5. The week-long Bible experience is packed with music, Bible stories, crafts, yummy snacks, fun games and more. With more than 100 children involved, many volunteers are involved as helpers and small group leaders. The 2017 date is the week of June 19.

Spiritual Formation

Children's Liturgy of the Word:

This program offers our children in Pre-K through Grade 2 the opportunity to hear and discuss the Word of God in a format more relevant to their age during the 8:45 and 10:45 a.m. Sunday Liturgies during the school year. We share the Word and discuss its meaning and how to apply it to our daily lives. We also pray together and do an activity to help us remember the message from the week. We do not teach, but merely facilitate childrens' conversations. Volunteers are provided with all materials including discussion topics.

Youth Ministry

Youth Ministry Event Chaperones are needed for the Youth Ministry program for kids in Grades 6 through 12. There are many events throughout the year with most of them dependent on adults who are willing to drive, attend or help prepare. Events include recreational activities, service trips or overnight lock-ins.

Retreat Chaperones are needed to guide the young people on their scheduled retreats. Help is needed with everything from planning for activities to setting up meals.

Summer Stretch is a Gospel-centered program for students entering Grades 6 through 8 that meets for six Wednesdays during the summer. This program helps and encourages students to put their faith into action. In the morning, participants reflect on the Word of God and perform service projects. In the afternoon, they go to an area recreational facility. The program concludes with an all-day celebration at Valley Fair with our students joining youth from nearly 50 area churches.

We are kicking off the 2016-2017 year with three new groups:

First Sundays (High School Youth Group) occur on the First Sunday of the month from 7 to 9 p.m.

Middle Sundays (Middle School Youth Group) occur on the Middle Sunday of the month from 5 to 7 p.m.

Core Team members serve at Youth Ministry events through participation in planning and leading events, music ministry, drama

ministry, leading prayer, giving talks, facilitating small groups, helping with set-up and clean-up, fundraising activities, leading games and ice breakers and serving in whatever capacity you are gifted to serve.
