### The readings for February 26

Eighth Sunday in Ordinary Time

Reading I: Isaiah 49:14-15

Reading II: 1 Corinthians 4:1-5

Gospel: Matthew 6:24-34



This Gospel challenges us to put our trust only in God. Jesus tells his followers: “You cannot give yourself to God and money.” The operative words here are “give yourself.” To live a responsible life in today’s world, we must deal with financial concerns. But when this concern becomes an obsession, money (or career) becomes one’s goal, one’s god, one’s master. What we are and what we have are gifts from God. Excessive worry indicates a lack of trust in God.

### Baptism Information

- Baptisms are celebrated on designated weekends during all three Masses and after the 5 p.m. Saturday and 10:45 a.m. Sunday Masses. The next scheduled Baptisms are Easter Sunday (April 16) for infants and children under seven during both 8:45 and 10:45 a.m. Masses and after the 10:45 a.m. Mass (**Please note:** Baptisms are not celebrated during Lent, March 1 to April 15.) Children seven and older and adults who have completed RCIA (Rite of Christian Initiation for Adults) will be Baptized at the Easter Vigil on Saturday, April 15.
- **You may have two sponsors (Godparents), one man and one woman, or just one sponsor.** At least one sponsor must be a Confirmed, practicing Catholic and they must be at least 16 years old.
- Parents are required to have attended a Jordan Night within the previous five years **before** a scheduled Baptism is celebrated. The next Jordan Night (Baptism class) is **Thursday, February 23**. ### Our Sympathies

Fr. Bernadine Hahn who served as Pastor of St. Victoria from 1952 to 1954 passed away on Wednesday, February 8 at the age of 101. Fr. Bernadine was ordained a Franciscan Priest on June 24, 1943, and served at parishes throughout the United States during his long career. In retirement he lived at the St. Anthony Friary in St. Louis where he served as Chaplain to the Poor Clare Sisters and later as Confessor to priests. He last visited St. Victoria in 2007 when he joined in our 150th Anniversary celebration.

### Catholic Services Appeal

In the bulletin this weekend you will find information and an envelope asking for your participation in the annual Catholic Service Appeal (CSA). It is important to remember that the Catholic Services Appeal Foundation is a separate entity and all monies collected are used only for the 17 designated ministries supported by the foundation. These ministries depend on our collective help.

CSA funds are used in a wide range of initiatives:

Consider homeless individuals waiting in line at the Dorothy Day Center for a hot meal, perhaps their only meal of the day. Or a young mother who needs help in finding housing, daycare or other needs for her family. Funds help support Marriage, Family and Life in a variety of programs and services.

When we consider Native Americans, we may think they all are enjoying the fruits of their casinos. But that is not true for many, especially those living in urban areas. Many are living in poverty without adequate housing, nutrition or other basic needs.

There's also tuition aid for families who wish to educate their children in our Catholic Schools but can't afford the tuition. And, there's aid for schools trying to provide that education to make sure they can keep their doors open in this economy.

Funds provide hospital chaplains who comfort patients and their loved ones during times that can be stressful and at times life-threatening. There are also funds for prison chaplains who counsel and minister to our brothers and sisters who have lost their way, helping them to realize that there is hope and a better way for their future lives and endeavors.

Of course, we all know we are facing an ever-growing shortage of priests. Funds are earmarked to help in the formation of young men for the priesthood.

I hope you will consider prayerfully what you can do to support the 17 ministries in 2017, ministries that provide aid and care to thousands throughout the Archdiocese..

Challenge for the Week (based on the readings above): "Love your enemies." It takes a lot of self-discipline in order to love those who are hard to love. If we let ourselves and our emotions go, we can lose what we are aiming for which is love. In the spirit of Lent right around the corner, work on self-discipline by fasting from something. It can be social media, sweets, you name it. It must be something that will take work though. Do not give up video games if you do not play video games!

## Safety Reminder

As a reminder: when you are dropping your children off at Faith Formation, please use the south driveway entrance at the far end of the parking lot.
