### The readings for March 5

First Sunday in Lent

Reading I: Genesis 2:7-9, 3:1-7

Reading II: Romans 5:12, 17-19

Gospel: Matthew 4:1-11



Following his baptism, Jesus fasted in the desert for 40 days. There he faced the same temptations to stop trusting God's care and power that Adam and Eve faced in the Garden of Eden, the same temptations faced by the Israelites in their 40-year journey through the desert to the Promised Land. Jesus shares the experience of his people but stays faithful and trusting. We now follow Jesus as God's people chosen in the New Covenant. We share his experience and seek the faith he lived so completely.

### Baptism Information

- Baptisms are celebrated on designated weekends during all three Masses and after the 5 p.m. Saturday and 10:45 a.m. Sunday Masses. The next scheduled Baptisms are Easter Sunday (April 16) for infants and children under seven during both 8:45 and 10:45 a.m. Masses and after the 10:45 a.m. Mass (**Please note:** Baptisms are not celebrated during Lent, March 1 to April 15.) Children seven and older and adults who have completed RCIA (Rite of Christian Initiation for Adults) will be Baptized at the Easter Vigil on Saturday, April 15.
- **You may have two sponsors (Godparents), one man and one woman, or just one sponsor.** At least one sponsor must be a Confirmed, practicing Catholic and they must be at least 16 years old.
- Parents are required to have attended a Jordan Night within the previous five years **before** a scheduled Baptism is celebrated. The next Jordan Night (Baptism class) is **Thursday, February 23**. This coming Wednesday, March 1, is Ash Wednesday, the beginning of our Lenten Season. This is a time of prayer and reflection as we prepare for the pain of the crucifixion of our Lord on Good Friday and then the joy at the news of His resurrection on Easter Sunday.

I hope you will join me at one of our Ash Wednesday Liturgies (8 a.m. and 6:30 p.m.), the time to begin our Lenten Journey. And, at St. Victoria a gathering nearly as large as our Christmas Eve Liturgies. I also encourage you to participate in our Stations of the Cross held each Friday at 6 p.m. during Lent.

### “Surge of the Heart”

And, special this year we will begin Holy Week with a Lenten Mission, “Surge of the Heart.” On Sunday, Monday and Tuesday evenings, April 9, 10 and 11, led by Jon Leonetti, Catholic speaker, best-selling author and radio host. ### Abstinence and Fasting

With the beginning of Lent on Ash Wednesday, Lenten abstinence and fasting begins. Abstinence means that all those age 14 and older should abstain from eating meat on Ash Wednesday and all Fridays during Lent.

Ash Wednesday and Good Friday are “penitential days,” a time of both abstinence and fasting. Fasting means that all those between the ages of 18 and 59 fast on Ash Wednesday and Good Friday, eating just one full meal and two others sufficient to maintain strength, according to one's needs, but not to equal another full meal. Drinking liquids can occur between meals.

## Readings for Sunday, February 26

1st Reading: Isaiah 49:14-15

Responsorial: Psalm 62:2-3, 6-9

2nd Reading: 1 Corinthians 4:1-5

Gospel: Matthew 6:24-34

Here is an excerpt from the book *Ascend* by Life Teen about today's readings.

*"Seek first the kingdom of God."*

The word Mammon comes from the Greek *mamonas* and Aramaic *mammon*, both meaning "riches." The distinction between worshipping God "or" mammon was a warning against us getting wrapped up in the pursuit of earthly wealth.

Discussion Questions:

+ Why does Jesus tell you, "do not worry about your life?"

What could that mean? Why is it so hard not to worry?

+ Do you trust God to control a situation or do you often find yourself trying to take control?

+ What is a "master" in your life that tends to take priority over God? How can you fix this issue?

Challenge for the Week:

Spend ten minutes outside in peace and quiet. Just look around and take in how beautiful everything is. Reflect on how God provides for everything (rain to keep grass green, tree limbs to hold bird nests, etc.). Find comfort in realizing God cares for everything in nature, but remember He cares for you even more.
