Sixth Sunday of Easter May 21, 2017

The readings for May 28 Ascension of the Lord *Reading 1*: Acts:1:1-11 *Reading II* Ephesians 1:17-33 *Gospel:* Matthew 28:16-20



The Ascension is a very consoling feast. It may not seem that way if you only think of Jesus leaving the apostles to carry on by themselves. Furthermore, Matthew says that when they first saw the risen Lord, "they worshipped, but some doubted," which indicates some were struggling to believe (Matthew 28:17). But then Jesus speaks words that have encouraged believers from then until now, first sending them (and now us) out to make disciples of all nations by baptizing others into the life of the Trinity and teaching them what Jesus taught. His final words in the Gospel have encouraged the Church through the centuries and continues to motivate and strengthen all who take them to heart.

Readings for Sunday, May 21, 2017

1st Reading: Acts 8:5-8, 14-17 Responsorial: Psalm 66:1-7, 16, 20 2nd Reading: 1 Peter 3:15-18 Gospel: John 14:15-21

Here is an excerpt from *Ascend* by Life Teen about today's readings:

"Always be ready to give an explanation ... for your hope."

Behind the Scenes: The scene in this week's first reading is one of the more intriguing episodes in Acts. We see Sts. Peter and John in Samaria — a place with long-standing tension toward the Jews — amazingly demonstrating their belief in Christ and accepting the word of God.

The line "that they might receive the Holy Spirit, for it had not yet fallen upon any of them" is puzzling to many modern Christians. How could those who've been baptized in the name of Jesus not have "received" the Holy Spirit yet or not had that reception fully animated?

The Church uses this episode as one example of the distinctions between the Sacraments of Baptism and Confirmation. While Baptism confers the Holy Spirit in a more "invisible" way, Confirmation unleashes the Spirit in more "visible" ways. Just as deacons, then and now, can baptize us, we see Sts. Peter and John – who are bishops – laying on hands and conferring the Holy Spirit upon the people, just as modern bishops still do at our own Sacrament of Confirmation. This distinction is one example of how these two Sacraments of Initiation are complementary but separate, as witnessed with the souls in Samaria who'd been initiated into the family but not yet fully realized the power and role of the Holy Spirit within them.

Journal: Who do you know that truly lets the Holy Spirit work through them? What are some of your favorite things about that person?

Challenge of the Week: The easiest way to rid our lives of hope is to be negative. It's really easy to be negative – phrases like, "Man, this weather is awful," slip out of our mouths almost unconsciously. This week, commit to being positive. This means a) no complaining and b) whenever something happens that makes you want to complain, offer it back to the Lord and trust that He has a purpose for the situation. You can do it!

Electronic Giving

June 1 Deadline for Scholarship Requests

Requests for scholarships are now being accepted from active St. Victoria parishioners who have been registered members of St. Victoria for at least six months and who do not otherwise qualify for a tuition discount or subsidy by reason of also being a member of the host school's parish. Parents who qualify may submit a scholarship request (found on the parish website) annually to request tuition assistance for children who are enrolled in Grades 1 through 8 in a neighboring Catholic School for the coming year. All completed request forms must be received by Deacon Ray in the parish office before June 1, 2017, to be considered for scholarship aid for the 2017/2018 school year. Due to budgeting requirements, no late scholarships requests will be considered. All scholarships will be disbursed, in equal amounts (as funds allow) directly to the school on a quarterly basis, provided students remain enrolled.
