The readings for June 18

The Body and Blood of Christ Reading 1: Deuteronomy 8:2-3, 14b-16a Reading II: 1 Corinthians 10:16-17 *Gospel:* John 6:51-58



Jesus provides "real food" and "real drink" in the Eucharist. his own "flesh" and "blood," to sustain the believer. In this Gospel the crowds find this hard to believe, but Jesus doesn't retreat from his statement. There is no question of Jesus' meaning: When we partake of the Eucharist, we have a share in eternal life — here and now. For John, eternal life is God's life, the life God shares with his Son. When we receive the Eucharist, we are united to Jesus and the Father. We share God's life. When we share Christ's life, we are already living eternally.

Question of the Week

Although receiving the Body and Blood of Christ is personal, it is not private. Christ gave us himself for "the life of the world." What commitments does the Eucharist call you to?

Emergency Procedures

Should there be a weather emergency during a Mass or other event, you are directed to go to the lower level classrooms using the stairways at the southwest end of the Worship Space and/or the stairway near the elevator. Go to a classroom without windows (not Clare's Well or St. Michael the Archangel on west side of the building). If the classrooms are overcrowded, the hallways away from the west end of the building are also safe. Please allow elderly and/or people with disabilities to use the elevator. If using the elevator, go down the ramp and to a classroom. If the elevator is not operating, and it is not possible to use the stairs, the men's and women's restrooms on the main level are a safe alternative.

If you are in the Historic Church, exit through the sacristy into the Worship Space and proceed as described above. Do not use the door between the Historic Church and the Worship Space because the fire door may come down automatically.

In case of fire, always exit the building by the closest available doorway, but do not use the doorway between the Historic Church and the Worship Space as the fire door may come down and this happens quickly.

In all cases, follow instructions from greeter/ushers and note signs posted throughout the buildings. If an emergency occurs during Faith Formation, children should follow instructions provided by their teachers.

Please note: There are flashlights in all classrooms and an AM/FM Weather Radio in the Pope Pius Room.
