Twenty-fifth Sunday of Ordinary Time

*Reading I:* Isaiah 55:6-9

*Reading II:* Philippians 1:20c-24, 27a

*Gospel:* Matthew 20:1-16a

The generosity of God continues to be highlighted in this Gospel. We accept God's gifts and try to live in such a way that shows gratitude and a willingness to imitate God's compassion. The message of the parable of the workers in the vineyard is that God's justice is far beyond our understanding. This parable may have been aimed at those Jewish Christians who resented God's call of the Gentiles to salvation.

## Generosity

Again this week I have the opportunity to thank you for your generosity. To date, you have contributed nearly \$5,000 to the Hurricane Harvey Appeal and money continues to be given. ## VIRTUS

All volunteers, 18 years or older, working with children and/or youth and vulnerable adults at St. Victoria are required to attend a VIRTUS Training Session. If you are a catechist or other Faith Formation volunteer, a Confirmation leader, Vacation Bible School volunteer, volunteer at special events and/or retreats, choir member or similar events where children and/or youth (or vulnerable adults) are present and have not attended VIRTUS in the past, please plan to attend the session we are offering on Tuesday, September 19, at 6 p.m. in Elstan Hall. **If you have not been trained, you must attend the September 19 session at St. Victoria or one at another parish in the Archdiocese before the start of Faith Formation or you will not be able to volunteer.** To register for a session, go to Virtus.org and click on the registration link and select Saint Paul and Minneapolis Archdiocese from the drop-down menu.

**Note:** If you previously completed VIRTUS Training, you must be recertified. This is a 30-minute, online update. You also may go to Virtus.org for this recertification. Please let Emily know when you have completed the recertification.

Please remember that this training is required for all volunteers working with children/youth and vulnerable adults both by St. Victoria and the Archdiocese of St. Paul and Minneapolis. At the same time, all volunteers must have completed a background check. This also can be completed on the Virtus website. We are audited twice a year to ensure compliance. You will not be able to volunteer without completing the training (or recertification).
