The readings for September 10

Twenty-third Sunday of Ordinary Time

Reading I: Ezekiel 33:7-9

Reading II: Romans 13:8-10

Gospel: Matthew 18:15-20



In the first reading Ezekiel has been appointed by God as “watchman.” Such a person had to keep watch and warn the city of approaching danger. For Ezekiel, personal responsibility is important. The prophet must warn individuals as well as the group. The Gospel reading treats this same theme. Matthew is the only Gospel writer to speak of relationships and responsibilities within the Church. He also offers practical guidelines for fulfilling these responsibilities. Serious community decisions are to be made only after serious prayer. Wisdom must be sought from God and from the presence of Christ in their midst.

Pilgrimage to LaCrosse WI

A one-day pilgrimage to La Crosse is planned on Wednesday, September 20, to the Cathedral of St. Joseph the Workman to view relics of St. Padre Pio including his hair, a shirt with the blood of his stigmata, his habit and priestly vestments and a glove hat covered his stigmata.

According to the St. Pio Foundation, the five marks of our Lord’s passion appeared on Padre Pio’s body on September 20, 1918, making him the only stigmatized priest in the history of the Catholic Church. Many people were attracted to his confessional and many more received his saintly counsel and spiritual guidance through correspondence. The Cathedral is one of the stops on the U.S. tour that marks the 130th anniversary of his birth and 15th anniversary of his canonization. For more information, go to saintpiofoundation.org.

VIRTUS

All volunteers, 18 years or older, working with children and/or youth and vulnerable adults at St. Victoria are required to attend a VIRTUS Training Session. If you are a catechist or other Faith Formation volunteer, a Confirmation leader, Vacation Bible School volunteer, volunteer at special events and/or retreats, choir member or similar events where children and/or youth are present and have not attended VIRTUS in the past, please plan to attend the session we are offering on Tuesday, September 19, at 6 p.m. in Elstan Hall. If you have not been trained, you must attend this session or one at another parish in the Archdiocese before the start of Faith Formation or you will not be able to volunteer. To register for a session, go to Virtus.org and click on the registration link and select Saint Paul and Minneapolis Archdiocese from the drop-down menu.

Note: If you previously completed VIRTUS Training, you must be recertified. This is a 30-minute, online update. You also may go to Virtus.org for this recertification. Please let Emily know when you have completed the recertification.

Please remember that this training is required for all volunteers working with children/youth and vulnerable adults both by St. Victoria and the Archdiocese of St. Paul and Minneapolis. At the same time, all volunteers must have completed a background check. This also can be completed on the Virtus website. We are audited twice a year to ensure compliance. You will not be able to volunteer without completing the training (or recertification).
