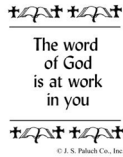

Thirty-first Sunday of Ordinary Time  
*Reading I:* Malachi 1:14b — 2:2b, 8-10  
*Reading II:* 1 Thessalonians 2:7-9, 13  
*Gospel:* Matthew 23:1-12



In this Gospel Jesus comes right out and accuses scribes and Pharisees, the religious leaders, of being false. Some Pharisees, who were supposed to be role models for the people, taught one thing but lived in another way. Jesus told the disciples to respect the Pharisees' positions as successors of Moses and to take their teaching seriously. But the disciples were not to follow the Pharisees' example. Jesus makes it clear to his followers that they must honor and respect God instead of being overly concerned about their own importance and power. They were called to serve others, not be applauded by them.

**This Week in RCIA**

This Tuesday, October 31, marks the 500th anniversary of the Protestant Reformation. In RCIA this week we will briefly explore some of the causes of this schism in the Church and how it coincided with and was reinforced by political, cultural and technological currents. We also will examine, from our Catholic perspective, the principal doctrinal differences between the Church and the early Protestants. Finally, we will consider how the "Protestant" approach has led to a proliferation of denominational and non-denominational Christian communities and how the Second Vatican Council views the relationship between them and the Catholic Church.
