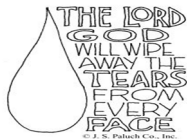
**The readings for October 15**

Twenty-eighth Sunday of Ordinary Time

*Reading I:* Isaiah 25:6-10

*Reading II:* Philippians 4:12-14, 19-20

*Gospel:* Matthew 22:1-14



In the Scriptures, meals are always occasions of sharing of life, memories and intimacy. This simple human experience represents the rich life shared between God and his people. The wedding banquet especially looks to the end time when God and his people will find a final sharing of life with each other. In this parable the first guests invited refuse to come. The king tells his servants to invite everyone they meet, “the bad as well as the good.” The Church will never be a perfect community of saintly people. All are invited. The only requirement is to receive the Good News willingly. God doesn’t care about the clothes we wear. The point is that to share in the heavenly banquet, one must sincerely be open to the Lord.

The Old Testament library is organized into several “collections” of writings, including the Torah (the Law), historical books, wisdom literature and the writings of the prophets. And each collection — each book — must be considered in the light of the whole of divine revelation as well as the genre (form) of the writing and the particular intention and situation of its human authors.

#### First Reconciliation Parent Meeting Reminder

On Wednesday, October 11, at 5 p.m. or 6:15 p.m. we will have our first meeting for the parents of children enrolled in our First Sacraments program. During this meeting you will receive your family packet as well as important information regarding your child's preparation and reception of the sacrament. Whether this is your first child receiving First Reconciliation or your tenth, it is very important that all children have at least one parent present. If you are a catechist, we will need you with your class, therefore please plan on sending someone else to the meeting or plan on attending the meeting that is held opposite your teaching time. If you cannot attend a meeting, please contact Emily or Sara to set up an individual meeting.

#### Safety Reminder

As a reminder (or as a first time notice for new families), when you are dropping your children off at Faith Formation, please use the south entrance at the far end of the parking lot. If your child is old enough (we would like to suggest 5th Grade and above) to walk in without an adult, use the first aisle as a pull-through/drop-off lane. If you are parking to walk your child in, please use any of the other lanes to park your car and walk in. Be sure you don't use the handicap spaces. The cones are to keep the area in front of the entrance completely clear for pedestrians. Please don't move them or drive through them. Following these guidelines for the parking lot during our busy drop-off/pick-up times will help us to be sure that we can keep everyone safe. **Note:** If anyone is around a little early or stays a few minutes late and would be willing to help supervise the parking lot area during drop-off and pick-up times, please let Sara know.
