The readings for December 31

Feast of the Holy Family

Reading 1: Genesis 15:1-6, 21:1-3

Reading II: Psalm105 Gospel: Luke 2:22-40



The Gospel reading begins with the simple scene of a devout Jewish family obeying the Law. The holy man Simeon then meets them and says that this child will fulfill the hopes of Israel. Not only that, he will be a "revealing light to the Gentiles." One of Luke's dominant themes is salvation for everyone. Gentiles as well as Jews. This simple and strong description of the Holy Family concludes with their return home to ordinary daily life in a small village.

Feast of Epiphany

Reading 1: Isaiah 60:1-6

Reading II: Ephesians 3:2-3a, 5-6

Gospel: Matthew 2:1-12



Epiphany means "manifestation," a revelation of Jesus as truly God. Matthew and Luke show this child to be divine through stories of "signs and wonders" when Jesus was an infant. Matthew's account of the visit of the three magi also shows the Church's mission to the Gentiles. Matthew's audience, largely Jewish Christians, was struggling to accept the presence of Gentile Christians in their community. Matthew shows in this Gospel passage that the salvation of Gentiles as well as Jews was indeed God's plan.

Reflection for Christmas Day

To the early Christians, Jesus was God's messenger. As the Gospel of John explains, he was God's Word who became flesh and made his dwelling among us. As one living among us he taught us God's way. Indeed he was a light shining in darkness, a herald of whom Christians would say, in the words of Isaiah, "How beautiful upon the mountains are the feet of him who brings glad tidings" (Isaiah 52:7). Still, some did not accept Him. Their hearts were hardened, unwilling to acknowledge that God could act through this humble unassuming person. For "he came to what was his own, but his own people did not accept him." (John 1:11). But "to those who did accept Him he gave power to become children of God." (John 1:12). In these words from the beginning of John's Gospel echoes one of the early Christians' most profound realizations: God's love for all people is so great that all are intended to be God's children, not servants or slaves, not distant participants in creation, but tied by the closest bonds — children of a loving God. Jesus announced the glad tidings of God's love for all, and Jesus taught that there are no obstacles for those who wish to be God's children. No power on earth, not even evil, sin, or death, can separate God's children from their loving Creator. Let us rejoice at the coming of God's messenger. Let us rejoice in the glad tidings he announced. Let us give thanks for the Light who came into our world and continues to shine in the darkness. (Courtesy of J.S. Paluch)

Christmas Masses

According to the United States Conference of Catholic Bishops (USCCB), when consecutive obligations (holy days and Sundays [or Saturday]) occur on Saturday/Sunday or Sunday/Monday, the expectation is that the faithful will attend Mass twice. This means that this year the expectation is that the faithful will attend Mass on the Fourth Sunday of Advent (December 23 and 24) at regular times on Saturday evening or Sunday morning and celebrate the Birth of Christ at Mass on Christmas Eve, December 24, at 4, 6 or 10 p.m. or Christmas morning, December 25, at 9 a.m. Masses will be at regular times on December 30 and 31 and at 9 a.m. on Monday, January 1, The Feast of the Solemnity of Mary.

Technology

We all know it's great when today's technology works, but when it doesn't it can be a pain! With that said, we have been having some heating and cooling issues and some difficulties with the sound system. Just so you know, we are working to address them. There are multiple heating and cooling systems, with the older spaces (Historic Church, Elstan Hall and the Youth Room) controlled by thermostats. The Worship Space and the Commons are programmed and controlled by computer and many things affect comfort levels, including the outside weather and the number of people attending Mass or an event. Great care is taken to make certain the environment is comfortable for everyone, but sometimes it just isn't quite right. And, as we all know, when one person is too warm, another person nearby may find it too cold.

We also are aware that the sound system has not been working properly in the Commons and the Historic Church. We are working with sound experts to remedy these limitations.

We ask for your patience. We also ask that you do not attempt to change settings where there are thermostats or to make any changes to the sound system unless you have trained to do so. Thank you!
