First Sunday of Advent December 3, 2017

The readings for December 10 Second Sunday of Advent *Reading 1*: Isaiah 40:1-5, 9-11 *Reading II*: 2 Peter 3:8-14 *Gospel*: Mark 1:1-8



Advent is a season of fresh beginnings. The writer of Second Isaiah gives people a message of hope and comfort. The exiles will return to Jerusalem on a straight and level road. Isaiah proclaims the good news that God is always faithful, a God of both power and tenderness. Mark begins the account of the Good News (the meaning of the word *gospel*). Jesus, God's son sent to heal us and lead us home, is himself the Good News. Mark begins by telling us about John the Baptist, the herald of the good news of Jesus' coming. Today, we are called to be heralds of this same Good News. We announce to a hurting world that Jesus Christ has experienced the worst we face and has come through it.

From the Pastor's Desk



O Come, O Come Emmanuel

Advent is already upon us, the season of expectant waiting and watching. Waiting to celebrate the first coming of Jesus in Bethlehem on Christmas Day. And watching for His Second Coming at the end of the Age, when Jesus returns in glory, bringing everlasting life to his holy people. But the season of Advent is more than these two historic bookends, past and future. It also is about experiencing God with us now.

As we sing "O Come, O Come Emmanuel" throughout Advent, we are invited to remember that God is with us always. That is what "Emmanuel" (or "Immanuel") means: "God with us." Matthew's Gospel (1:23) clearly associates this title with Jesus. Through the Mystery of the Incarnation, God forever united His Divinity with our humanity as the ultimate fulfillment of His promise to be with us forever. That promise was delivered most emphatically many centuries earlier in the words of the prophet Isaiah (7:14), cited by Matthew as fulfilled in Jesus Christ: "the virgin shall be with child, and bear a son, and shall name him Immanuel." But though the title Immanuel may have originated in Isaiah, the truth behind it was not new. God was with us intimately in the Garden when He made us and walked with us before we left Him. Even so, He began to call us back to Himself through his chosen people, consoling Jacob (the first Israel) with this promise: "know that I am with you [and] I will never leave you" (Gen. 28:15).

After the Chosen People had lost their way in the desert of sin following the Exodus, God again called them back to renewed intimacy with the same promise of His abiding presence with His people: "I Myself will go along [with you]" (*Ex. 33:14*), a Glorious Presence that manifested itself in those days over the Ark of the Covenant in the Tent of Dwelling (Tabernacle). But on the Last Day, when Jesus comes in glory, we ourselves will become the tent of God's indwelling within us: "Behold, God's dwelling is with the human race. He will dwell with them and they will be His people and God Himself will always be with them" (*Rev. 21:3*).

God is already with us, but not yet. He has come, but He will come again. In the meantime, particularly in the lengthening shadows and darkness that define this time of year, let us be consoled and encouraged by these words from our Advent hymn:

> "O come, O Dayspring from on high, And cheer us by your drawing nigh; Disperse the gloomy clouds of night, And death's dark shadow put to flight. Rejoice! Rejoice! Emmanuel Shall come to you, O Israel."
