Second Sunday in Ordinary Time *Reading 1*: 1 Samuel 3:3-10b, 19 *Reading II*: 1 Corinthians 6:13-15, 17-20 *Gospel*: John 1:35-42

John the Baptist's role is to identify Jesus as the Lamb of God who will forgive the sins of the world. This statement recognizes Jesus' importance and leads John's disciples to leave him to follow Jesus, the Son of God. In this short section of the Gospel, much is said about openness, for example, the ability to accept the word about Jesus and letting one's heart be moved.

Baptism Information

- Baptisms are celebrated on designated weekends during all three Masses and after the 5 p.m. Saturday and 10:45 a.m. Sunday Masses. The next scheduled Baptisms will be celebrated February 10 and 11. This is the last time Baptisms will be celebrated until Easter Sunday, April 1. Baptisms are not celebrated during Lent except in an emergency. (Adults will be Baptized at the Easter Vigil, March 31.)
- You may have two sponsors (Godparents), one man and one woman, or just one sponsor. At least one sponsor must be a Confirmed, practicing Catholic and be at least 16 years old.
- Parents are required to have attended a Jordan Night (Baptism Class) within the previous five years **before** a scheduled Baptism is celebrated. The next Jordan Night is scheduled on **Thursday, January 11.**

New Year Reflection

My Christmas homily about the bunny stirred up a lot of good conversation among families I am told.

For those who were at the 4 and 6 p.m. Masses on Christmas Eve, I had offered a shorter version. I offer the ending to the longer version here that includes my thoughts on the bunny story.

"Now about the story, I struggled with it because the bunny died and for a Christmas story that doesn't make for a very happy ending. But he did it for the sake of another. So did the one born in Bethlehem two thousand years ago. He too died for the sake of the other. A love that is willing to die for the sake of others, that's the power of love.

Then, there is that moment of recognition for the bunny. 'All the animals in the forest are my family.' It's the same for us. No matter how different we are, we're all part of the human family. How different things would be if we could come to realize that. It's Christmas that invites us to open ourselves to that possibility."

As we head into a new year, I share this reflection from *Howard Thurman:*

When the song of the angels is stilled, When the star in the sky is gone, When the kings and princes are home, When the shepherds are back with their flock, The work of Christmas begins: To find the lost, To heal the broken, To heal the broken, To feed the hungry, To release the prisoners, To rebuild the nations, To bring peace among others, To make music in the heart.
