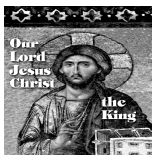
**The readings for November 20**

Reading I: 2 Samuel 5:1-3

Reading II: Colossians 1:12-20

Gospel: Luke 23:35-43



During his adult life, Jesus was often put down because he “welcomed sinners and ate with them.” Now he is condemned to die with criminals. The man we have come to know as the good thief turns to Jesus and calls him simply by name, “Jesus,” and begs only to be “remembered.” By doing so he simply acknowledges the inscription on the cross and that Jesus has a kingdom to enter. The thief gets more than he ever asked for: He will enter paradise on that very day. In a word, the criminal was *saved* by Jesus the “savior.” The good thief’s plea becomes a ray of hope for all, by turning in faith to him who came as a “savior.”

- Parents are required to have attended a Jordan Night within the previous five years **before** a scheduled Baptism is celebrated. The next Jordan Night (Baptism class) is **Thursday, December 1**.

### Sharing Some Thoughts

Two things we are talking about this weekend are personal to me and I would like to share my thoughts about them.

#### Michael Boylan

This year, Michael will share his story and his music with us at our annual La Noche Azul Dinner. I have had the pleasure of knowing Michael both as a parishioner and a friend. He will share his journey as a businessman, a family man and most importantly, the father of a special-needs child.

This has not been a blissful journey, but one with many ups and downs over the last 16 years. Life was good, his business as a developer of productivity enhancing programs was booming and, along with his wife and daughter, he had welcomed a baby boy, Connor, into their family. Recognizing first that something was amiss with the little guy and then getting to the diagnosis that he suffered from Williams Syndrome, a genetic abnormality of the brain, was heart-wrenching and time consuming. That was followed with learning to live with a special-needs child, coupled with business setbacks following 9/11. It took a toll on the family and eventually Michael found himself a single dad.

In his book, *Reach for Me — The Story of My Son Connor*, Michael shares the lessons he learned on the ensuing journey: patience, unconditional love, to enjoy the simple things in life like a special smile, or a gentle touch. And through it all, his faith deepened and he found he could surrender to God's plans. And, with his book and in speaking engagements, he has shared his journey with the intent of helping other caretakers to know they are not alone. But Michael — and Connor — can be an inspiration to all of us.

I can honestly say that Michael has been an inspiration to me. I hope you will join me on December 5 to hear him. There is a message there for everyone! See the flyer to sign up for La Noche Azul. You might also want to pick up a copy of his book.

#### Venezuela

This weekend we welcomed Fr. James Peterson (who, by the way, graduated from Holy Family Catholic High School) at all our Masses. He shared with us the desperate plight of the people in Venezuela, including the religious in the Diocese of Ciudad Guayana and elsewhere. As many of you know, I spent five years in Venezuela and know some of the priests who are unable to provide food, medical care or adequate housing for their parishioners or themselves.

Fr. Greg Schaffer, a priest of this Archdiocese who has been assigned to the parish of Jesucristo Resucitado for many years, and who has visited St. Victoria numerous times, said some of the priests there have had to find other ways to make money because collections aren't nearly enough to provide for their parishioners let alone feed themselves. One priest is working in construction and another drives long distances every day to purchase cheese from a friend that he then sells to restaurants and small grocery stores. Fr. Greg is attempting to raise funds to build a hospice to care for elderly and handicapped individuals (including retired priests) who have been abandoned by their families in an effort to provide them love and dignity.

My hope is that we send Fr. James back with funds to help our brothers and sisters that he serves. In the future, if you want to make a donation, let us know and we will make sure the money gets to Fr. Peterson and/or Fr. Greg.
