Solemnity of The Ascension of the Lord

*Reading I:* Acts 1:1-11

*Reading II:* Ephesians 1:17-23

*Gospel:* Luke 24:46-53



Why do you stand looking at the sky? .....

In both accounts of the Ascension, Jesus' disciples are given a mission: to be witnesses to the ends of the earth. They will preach Christ's saving death and resurrection from the dead, leading to repentance for the forgiveness of sins. In Luke's Gospel, Jesus refers to the Spirit he is sending them as "the promise of the Father" (24:49). Then he is taken up to heaven. Acts sets out a similar scene, with Jesus again urging them to wait on the Spirit who will empower them to become his witnesses throughout the earth. A wonderful effect is the appearance of two angels who find the disciples looking up as Jesus disappears in the cloud. "Why are you standing there looking up?" they ask, implying that it's time to get moving and start witnessing.

**Baptism Information**

- Baptisms are celebrated on designated weekends during all three Masses and after the 5 p.m. Saturday and 10:45 a.m. Sunday Masses. The next scheduled Baptisms are the weekend of May 7 and 8.
- You may have two sponsors (Godparents), one man and one woman, or just one sponsor. At least one sponsor must be a Confirmed, practicing Catholic and they must be at least 16 years old.
- Parents are required to have attended a Jordan Night within the previous five years **before** a scheduled Baptism is celebrated. The next Jordan Night (Baptism class) is **Thursday, June 2.**

This is also a good time to check the lost and found box (on the coat rack in the Commons) and the cabinet (near the kitchen) for plates, bowls and pans that you may have left after making a food donation for a funeral. Unclaimed items will be donated to the Rummage Sale.

## Scholarship Requests

Requests for scholarships are now being accepted from active St. Victoria parishioners who have been registered members of St. Victoria for at least six months — and who do not otherwise qualify for a tuition discount or subsidy by reason of also being a member of the host school's parish. Parents who qualify are invited to submit the scholarship request (found on the parish website) annually to request tuition assistance for children who are enrolled in Grades 1 through 8 in a neighboring Catholic School for the coming year. All completed request forms must be received by Deacon Ray in the parish office before June 1, 2016, to be considered for scholarship aid for the 2016/2017 school year. **Due to budgeting requirements, no late scholarship requests will be considered.** All scholarships will be disbursed, in equal amounts (as funds allow) directly to the school on a quarterly basis, provided students remain enrolled.
