



"In the beginning." (1:1) The Book of Genesis is a book of beginnings. The beginning of all that is, from the heavens to the earth, from the creatures of the sea and sky, to man and woman. But it is not the beginning of God, who IS from before the beginning and who will BE after the end. All that is, all that came to be, all that has yet to come, is divinely imbued with a participation in the Oneness, the Goodness and the Being of God. But Genesis deals with more than creation, per se. It also reveals for us the beginnings of God's plan of salvation for the descendants and the family of Man, who separated himself from Oneness with God and from God's Goodness, thereby forfeiting Man's own life and his very being but for the Grace of God which begins to unfold in Genesis, particularly in the call of Abraham, man of faith and friend of God. In this Bible study we will explore what it means to be a child of God who is at the same time both sinner and saint.
