**The readings for March 20**

Palm Sunday

*Reading I:* Isaiah 50:4-7

*Reading II:* Philippians 2:6-11

*Gospel:* Luke 22:14-23:56



The passion narrative in Luke's Gospel pulls together many of Jesus' teachings. The Last Supper recalls the meals Jesus shared with outcasts and sinners. Jesus uses this meal and the cross as the entry to the fullness of the heavenly banquet where we will eat again with him and with each other. On the way to Calvary, he continues to call the people to repent, to change their hearts. Jesus continues to reach out and forgive, even from the cross. He forgives his killers and offers salvation to the repentant thief. Jesus dies as he lives, the obedient and faithful servant of God. Because of this he is raised up in the kingdom.

**Baptism Information**

- The next scheduled Baptisms are Easter Sunday, March 27. Baptisms will be celebrated during the 8:45 and 10:45 a.m. Masses and after the 10:45 a.m. Mass. There may be adult Baptisms celebrated at the Easter Vigil Liturgy. (Baptisms are not celebrated during Lent except in an emergency.) In April, Baptisms will be celebrated the weekend of April 9 and 10.
- Baptisms are celebrated during all three weekend Masses and after the 5 p.m. Saturday and 10:45 a.m. Sunday Masses.
- You may have two sponsors (Godparents), one man and one woman or just one sponsor. One sponsor must be a Confirmed, practicing Catholic and they must be at least 16 years old.
- Parents are required to have attended a Jordan Night within the previous five years **before** a scheduled Baptism is celebrated. The next Jordan Night (Baptism class) is **Thursday, June 2.**

## Jubilee Year of Mercy

As most of you know by now, Pope Francis has declared this year a Jubilee of Mercy. He has called for a "revolution of tenderness" asking Catholics to "cultivate the tenderness and mercy of God" toward one another. Catholic tradition has identified ways of cultivating that tenderness and mercy of God — the Seven Corporal and the Seven Spiritual Works of Mercy. Over the next months, we will explore these Works of Mercy and what they mean for us.

One of the Seven Spiritual Works of Mercy is to forgive offenses willingly. This can be a two-way street — as we forgive those who have offended us, we can also ask forgiveness through the Sacrament of Reconciliation. Recently, our Archdiocese offered reconciliation for a 24-hour period at both the Cathedral and the Basilica with successful turnouts. And, my fellow priest Fr. Kevin Anderson who is in the St. Cloud Diocese, said they had a "Mercy Sunday" at four key locations throughout the diocese offering reconciliation for 12 hours and they were "packed" all day.

I encourage you to take advantage of upcoming opportunities if you have not done so already. We will have private confessions here at St. Victoria beginning at 6 p.m. on Tuesday, March 22. Or you might want to participate in the all-day reconciliation planned at Sts. Joachim and Anne on Wednesday, March 23, from 9 a.m. to 7:30 p.m., at the St. Mark's Church. (There are other reconciliation dates listed on page 2 of this bulletin.)

## Palm Sunday, March 20

On Palm Sunday, we all gather in the Franciscan Commons, where the Gospel account of Jesus' triumphant entrance into Jerusalem is proclaimed and we receive palm branches that are then blessed.

*"The very large crowd spread their cloaks on the road, while others cut branches from the trees and strewed them on the road. The crowds preceding him and those following kept crying out and saying 'Hosanna to the Son of David'" (Matthew 21:8-9).*

We then process into the church. Ordinarily, when we go to Sunday Mass we enter the church one by one as we arrive. But on Palm Sunday we enter the church together.

If you pay special attention to the second reading, Philippians 2:6-11, it "summarizes" the meaning of Holy Week. *"Christ Jesus emptied himself, becoming obedient to the point of death, even death on a cross. Because of this, God greatly exalted him and bestowed on him the name which is above every name."* As the Passion is read, we go with Christ to Calvary and stand at the foot of the cross. We call out *"Crucify him! Crucify him!"* Yet only a moment ago, when we were entering the church, we were triumphantly singing, *"Hosanna to the Son of David!"* This is quite the contrast. Does this not sound like our own lives? One moment we are full of good resolutions and promises to follow Christ, but when the times get hard, we find ourselves ready to ignore Jesus, deny Jesus, or even crucify him. But even in dying, Jesus' mercy endures, "Father, forgive them for they know not what they do."

The final session, "Annulments: Fact vs Fiction" will be held this Monday, March 14, 6:30 to 8:30 p.m. at Guardian Angels in Chaska. Amy Tadlock, a Canon Lawyer and Judge in the Metropolitan Tribunal of the Archdiocese will discuss the subject to dispel the misconceptions about annulments by explaining some of the more common misunderstandings and answering many of the frequently asked questions
