The readings for September 18

Twenty-Fifth Sunday of Ordinary Time

Reading I: Amos 8:4-7

Reading II: 1 Timothy 2:1-8

Gospel: Luke 16:1-13



The point of the parable in this Gospel is that Christians should exercise at least as much clever thinking in the pursuit of good as this fellow did in the pursuit of ill-gotten gain. Luke goes on to suggest to his audience that they are to use their money in a way that will merit God's blessing, for example, by sharing with the poor. One has to be concerned about money, but a thin line divides concern and being controlled. When one steps over that line and *gives oneself* to money, one becomes its slave. Quite simply, "you cannot *give yourself* to God and Money."

- Parents are required to have attended a Jordan Night within the previous five years **before** a scheduled Baptism is celebrated. The next Jordan Night (Baptism class) is **Thursday, December 1**.

Last week, when Mother Teresa was canonized a saint, was an especially poignant moment for our neighbor to the west, Fr. Thomas Joseph, Pastor of St. Nicholas in Carver. In 1996, in Calcutta, India, holding his hands in hers, Mother Teresa asked Joseph to repeat, "I will. I want, with God's blessing, to be holy." Fr. Joseph was a volunteer for Mother Teresa's Missionaries of Charity. He said he wanted to meet her and share her vision of charity. She sent him to Tijuana, Mexico, to study for the priesthood. "For the rest of my life, I will never tire of repeating her name. I always tell people she used to say 'let no one come to you, and go away not feeling better and happier.'" (To read more about Fr. Faith Formation Registration for 2016/2017

All families currently registered in our Faith Formation program should have received registration information for the 2016/2017 Faith Formation and Sacrament season in April. Please contact Emily if you did not receive the registration information via email or you are new to the parish and need additional information about our ministry. As of September 1, registration fees increase to \$95 per child. Sacramental Fees for Confirmation and First Sacraments remain the same. Current calendar now available on our website.

VIRTUS

All volunteers, 18 years or older, working with children and/or youth at St. Victoria are required to attend a VIRTUS Training Session. If you are a catechist or other Faith Formation volunteer, a Confirmation leader, Vacation Bible School volunteer, volunteer at special events and/or retreats, choirs or similar events where children and/or youth are present and have not attended VIRTUS in the past, and did not attend the August 9 training at St. Victoria, please plan to attend the **session we are offering on Saturday, September 17, at 9 a.m. If you have not been trained, you must attend this session or one at another parish in the Archdiocese before the start of Faith Formation or you will not be able to volunteer for any position.** To register for a session, go to Virtus.org and click on the registration link and select Saint Paul and Minneapolis Archdiocese from the drop-down menu.

Note: If you previously completed VIRTUS Training, you must be recertified. This is a 30-minute, online update. You also may go to Virtus.org for this recertification. Please let Emily know when you have completed the recertification.

Please remember that this training is **required** for all volunteers working with children and youth both by St. Victoria and the Archdiocese of St. Paul and Minneapolis. We are audited twice a year to ensure compliance. You will not be able to volunteer without completing the training (or recertification).
